WHEREAS, 269 WMR EW3, LLC, (hereinafter the "Developer") is the owner of a parcel of land located within the Township of East Windsor more particularly described as Block 12, Lot 2 on the Official Tax Map of the

Township of East Windsor; and

WHEREAS, the Developer has submitted to the East Windsor Municipal Utilities Authority (hereinafte "Authority" of "EWMUA") for approval Plans and Specifications for the construction of certain water and sanitary sewer facilities to be located on and in the vicinity of Block 12, Lot 2 on the Official Tax Map of the Township of East Windsor for providing sanitary sewer and water service to that development known as "269 WMR" (the "Development"), consisting of a building with a footprint of 159,974 square feet containing 120,326 square feet of warehouse and 9,174 square feet of office and 30,474 square feet o mezzanine, more particularly described on plans on plans entitled "Preliminary and Final Major Site Plar and Minor Subdivision Plan for 269 WMR, Lot 2, Block 12, East Windsor Township, Mercer County, New Jersey" and "Pump Station, Force Main and Water Main Plans for 269 Wyckoff Mills Road" prepared by Maser Consulting, P. A., dated June 14, 2017, latest revisions dated September 10,2018, for the site plans and dated June, 2017, with latest revisions dated September 10,2018 for the pump station, force main and water main plan, as approved by the Authority ("Approved Plans and Specifications") and any other agency with jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board of the Township of East Windsor ("Approving Board" or "Board") granted amended preliminary and final site plan approval on March 12, 2018 and memorialized on April 9, 2018 for the subject property; and

WHEREAS, the Developer and the Authority desire to enter into an agreement setting forth the rights, duties and obligations of the parties in connection with the construction of the water and sanitary sewer Chemres 10/12/2018

utility improvements related to said Development, including off-tract improvement obligations of th Developer.
