The regular monthly meeting of the East Windsor Municipal Utilities Authority was held on Thursday, April 20, 2023 at the Administration Building on Wiltshire Drive and called to order by Chairperson Moore at 5:30 p.m.

Chairperson Moore requested that the Public Notice be read. The secretary read the statement stating that the agenda for this meeting was e-mailed to the Cranbury Press Windsor Hights Herald and Trenton Times on Tuesday, April 11, 2023. An agenda was posted on the official bulletin board of the Authority and delivered to the Township Clerk for posting on the bulletin board at the East Windsor Township Municipal Complex on Friday, April 14, 2023. Chairperson Moore then asked the Secretary for a roll call after which she asked if any Member had any objection to holding this meeting as advertised. No one objected.

Chairperson Moore asked if there was anyone present that would like to speak on any issue not on tonight's agenda. Hearing no one Chairperson Moore closed the public portion of the meeting.

Chairperson Moore, asked for approval of Resolution 2023-19 to update the Rules and Regulations Chapter IV and the FOG Policy. Mr. Kurs made the motion, seconded by Mr. Lippman and unanimously carried.

RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE AMENDING OF THE RULES AND REGULATIONS, LIMITATIONS ON WASTEWATER DISCHARGERS (LOCAL LIMITS)

Resolution # 2023-19

WHEREAS, the East Windsor Municipal Utilities Authority deemed it necessary due to the potential growth of commercial and industrial users to update the rules and regulations, specifically the unpermitted discharge of Fats, Oil, and Grease and other harmful unpermitted discharges; and

WHEREAS, the East Windsor Municipal Utilities Authority ("EWMUA") owns and operates a Water Pollution Control Plant ("WPCP"), also known as a Publicly Owned Treatment Works ("POTW"); and

WHEREAS, East Windsor Municipal Utilities Authority Water Pollution Control Plant ("EWMUA WPCP") is designed to treat 4.50 million gallons per day (MGD) of wastewater on a monthly average basis. The EWMUA manages a tributary sewer system for the EWMUA WPCP. The EWMUA WPCP is an advanced treatment system which includes a bar screen, grit removal, primary clarifiers, bio-aeration/oxidation, anoxic chambers, final clarifiers (and flocculation), sand/gravity filters and ultraviolet disinfection system. The sludge from the primary and secondary clarifiers is collected in sludge holding and thickener tanks prior to disposal offsite. The effluent from the EWMUA WPCP is discharged to the Millstone River. The sludge is transported offsite to the Stony Brook Regional Sewerage Authority (SBRSA) for incineration, with disposal by land application as a backup option. The EWMUA WPCP is regulated by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection ("NJDEP") under a NJPDES permit, NJ0023787; and

WHEREAS, EWMUA Local Limits were established to regulate the introduction of pollutants from non-domestic sources into the POTW. POTW's are generally designed to treat domestic wastewater and wastes compatible with the domestic waste. However, generally

wastewater of non-domestic nature generated at industrial and/or commercial sites are also discharged to a POTW along with the domestic wastewater. The Federal General Pretreatment Regulations, 40 CFR 403, were developed to protect a POTW from discharge of industrial or commercial wastewaters which may interfere or are incompatible with the operation of a POTW; and

WHEREAS, these regulations are established to regulate non-domestic dischargers to the WPCP and to prevent introduction of pollutants which may pass-through the treatment works; prevent damage to the infrastructure; prevent backups or overflows into basements or into the environment which end up in our streams and rivers; prevent introduction of pollutants to the POTW which may interfere with the operation, including interference with use or disposal of its municipal sludge; improve opportunities to recycle and reclaim municipal and industrial wastewater and sludge's; and

WHEREAS, after review of the Local Limits section and Chapter IV, "Application for sewer service", the EWMUA Executive Director felt it was necessary for the Authority to protect itself from unpermitted discharges that has caused damages to EWMUA conveyance system and township roadways: and

WHEREAS, the EWMUA relied on three strategies to control wastewater discharges of non-domestic nature to the WPCP, the Prohibited Discharge Standards: stated in the General Pretreatment Regulations 40 CFR 403.5; National Categorical Standards: industry-specific effluent limitations developed by USEPA; and Local Discharge Limitations: enforceable local discharge requirements developed by the POTW to protect the POTW and which are addressed under local regulations.; and

WHEREAS, the unpermitted discharges, especially Fats, Oil and Grease have increased over 100% the last 3 years which has taken staff away from other duties and increased EWMUA disposal and labor cost; and

WHEREAS, in 2021, the East Windsor Municipal Utilities Authority updated its Fats, Oil and Grease policy (FOG) to better educate the business community in the removal of Fats, oil and grease from the domestic wastewater conveyance system and enforce the Rules and Regulations governing these discharges; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the East Windsor Municipal Utilities Authority ("MUA" or "Authority") as follows:

- 1. The preamble to this Resolution shall be incorporated herein as if fully restated.
- Chapter IV, Categorization of Commercial/Industrial User Significant Major User section 4-4.0202(d) be amended to appendix III and the body of the text reflect the new location of the local limits (page 408, Rules and Regulations).
- 3. Table 2, be amended to appendix III and the body of the text reflect the new location of the local limits.

The Authority Chairperson and Secretary are hereby authorized and directed to sign any necessary documents, and the Authority staff and professionals are authorized and directed to undertake all action's necessary, to effectuate the terms and intent hereof.
