RESOLUTION NO. 2025-13

RISK MANAGEMENT CONSULTANT'S AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT entered into this 1st day of	January	, 2025 <u> </u>	, between the
East Windsor Municipal Utilities Authority (hereinafter referred	to as AU'	THORITY) and
Chas E. Rue & Son, Inc. t/a Rue Insurance (h	ereinafter referred	to as the C	CONSULTANT).

WHEREAS, the CONSULTANT has offered to the AUTHORITY professional risk management consulting services as required in the bylaws of the New Jersey Utility Municipal Joint Insurance Fund, and;

WHEREAS, the AUTHORITY desires these professional services pursuant to the resolution adopted by the governing body of the AUTHORITY at a meeting held on February 20, 2025 and;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants set forth herein, agree as follows:

- 1. For and in consideration of the amount stated hereinafter, the CONSULTANT shall:
 - a) Assist the AUTHORITY in identifying its insurable Property & Casualty exposures and to recommend professional methods to reduce, assume or transfer the risk or loss.
 - b) Assist the AUTHORITY in understanding the various coverages available from the New Jersey Utility Authority Joint Insurance Fund and the Municipal Excess Liability Joint Insurance Fund.
 - c) Review with the AUTHORITY any additional coverages that the CONSULTANT feels should be carried but are not available from the FUND and subject to the AUTHORITY's authorization, place such coverages outside the FUND.
 - d) Assist the AUTHORITY in the preparation of applications, statements of values, and similar documents requested by the FUND, it being understood that this Agreement does not include any appraisal work by the CONSULTANT.
 - e) Review Certificates of Insurance from contractors, vendors and professionals when requested by the AUTHORITY.
 - f) Review the AUTHORITY's assessment as prepared by the FUND and assist the AUTHORITY in the preparation of its annual insurance budget.
 - g) Review the loss and engineering reports and generally assist the safety committee in its loss containment objectives. Also, attend no less than one (I) authority safety committee meeting per annum to promote the safety objectives and goals of the AUTHORITY and the FUND.
 - h) Assist where needed in the settlement of claims, with the understanding that the scope of the CONSULTANT's involvement does not include the work normally done by a public adjuster.

- i) Perform any other risk management related services required by the FUND's bylaws.
- 2. In exchange for the above services, the CONSULTANT shall be compensated in the following manner:
 - a) The CONSULTANT shall be paid by the AUTHORITY a fee as compensation for services rendered, an amount equal to six percent (6%) of the AUTHORITY's annual assessment as promulgated by the FUNDs. Said fee shall be paid to the CONSULTANT within thirty (30) days of payment of the AUTHORITY's assessment.
 - b) For any insurance coverages authorized by the AUTHORITY to be placed outside the FUND, the CONSULTANT shall receive as compensation the normal brokerage commissions paid by the insurance company. The premiums for said policies shall not be added to the FUND's assessment in computing the fee outlined in 2 (a).
 - c) If the AUTHORITY shall require of the CONSULTANT extra services other than those outlined above, the CONSULTANT shall be paid by the AUTHORITY a fee at the rate of ___0__ per hour, in addition to actual expenses incurred.
- 3. The term of this Agreement shall be one (1) year. However, this Agreement may be terminated by either party at any time by mailing to the other written notice, certified mail return receipt, calling for termination at not less than thirty (30) days thereafter. In the event of termination of this Agreement, the CONSULTANT's fees outlined in 2 (a) above shall be prorated to date of termination.

Resolution Awarding Contract for Installation of a New Natural Gas Main to the New Facilities on Millstone Road

WHEREAS, the East Windsor Municipal Utilities Authority (Authority) had awarded a professional services contract for Architecture services for the design and construction of a maintenance and administration building ("facilities") on Millstone Road, East Windsor Twp.; and

WHEREAS, these "Facilities" require natural gas for the operation of heating, hot water and natural gas generators that supply heat and emergency power to the buildings; and

WHEREAS, Public Service Electric and Gas ("PSE&G") is the sole supplier of natural gas in the area; and

WHEREAS, the Authority received a quote from "PSE&G not to exceed \$176,044.28 to furnish and install a 6" gas main from Old Trenton Road, along Millstone Road to each of the facilities; and

WHEREAS, a recapture agreement between PSE&G and EWMUA will be in effect for anyone connecting to this line in the future; and

WHEREAS, adequate funds are available in an amount sufficient to defray the expenditure of money as evidenced by the Financial Officer's Certification, and

WHEREAS, the Local Public Contract Law, N.J.S.A. 40A11-1 et seq. authorizes the award of this contract without public bidding on the basis that the services are to be performed by a sole provider and are specifically exempted under N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the East Windsor Municipal Utilities Authority, County of Mercer, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. The Authority hereby specifically determines that the procedures followed in connection with the award of this contract is in full compliance with and awarding such contracts, as set forth in Local Public Contract Law, N.J.S.A. 40A11-1 et seq.
- 2. PSE&G is hereby approved to furnish and install a 6" gas line to each of the 3 buildings located at the new facility on Millstone Road.

- 3. PSE&G contractors are required to comply with the Affirmative Action requirements of N.J.A.C. 17:27.
- 4. The chairperson of the Authority is hereby authorized to execute a service agreement and any other agreement with PSE&G for the construction of this 6" gas main and service lines to each (3) buildings.

- 2. <u>Rate for Water Usage</u>: In addition to the quarterly minimum service charge, each customer shall be charged a rate of \$3.31 per 1,000 gallons of usage.
- 3. <u>Required Minimum Payment</u>: The quarterly minimum service charge shall be paid regardless of usage.
- 4. <u>Multi-units</u>: The quarterly minimum service charge for multi-unit residential dwellings serviced through a single water meter shall be determined by the product of the number of units times the quarterly minimum service charge for 5/8' meter as established in this rate schedule. In addition, the rate for water usage set forth in Section 2 here of shall be applicable to multi-unit residential dwellings.
- **Commercial Accounts: For every (1) Washing Machine, it will equal ½ of Meter Unit.
 - 5. Public Fire Service: For each public fire hydrant, the cost per quarter is \$0.00.

For each private fire hydrant not connected to a metered service, the cost per quarter is \$352.87.

Fire service lines shall be installed with an approved detector check valve and a proper size bypass meter. Any water not used for fire protection and registered on the by-pass meter will be charged according to meter size established in the rate schedule.

Schedule II Sewer Service Effective March 1, 2025

1. Residential Properties

All residential properties, including single family dwellings, each unit in a multi-family dwelling, condominiums, townhouses, apartments, and mobile homes shall pay a quarterly service charge, consisting of a fixed minimum charge for up to 23,000 gallons per quarter, plus an additional charge per 1,000 in excess of 23,000 gallons per quarter as set forth in the following chart:

2. Non-Residential Properties

All non-residential properties, including but not limited to, office buildings; mercantile establishments; automatic or self-service laundries; public, private or parochial schools; churches; restaurants; hotels; motels; movie theaters; supermarkets; and all other types of commercial institutional or industrial properties shall pay a sewer service charge, based upon consumption, consisting of a fixed minimum charge for up to 13,000 gallons per quarter, plus an additional charge per 1,000 in excess of 13,000 gallons per quarter as set forth in the following chart:
