Notice of Semi-Annual Hydrant Flushing Program

Customers of the East Windsor Municipal Utilities Authority are being notified of our upcoming semi-annual hydrant flushing program.

To maintain high quality of water and reliable service, the East Windsor Municipal Utilities Authority will begin opening fire hydrants to flush sediment from water mains, monitor water flows and pressure, and perform visual inspection of the hydrants. During this process, customers may temporarily experience a drop in water pressure or notice discolored water. At no time will the water quality or safety of the water be compromised. The water remains safe for use.

Below is the current schedule of areas where flushing will take place:

Week of April 13, 2026 through April 17, 2026
Twin Rivers Section of the Township and Centex area

Week of April 20, 2026 through April 24, 2026
Windsor Regency, Georgetown, Cranbury Manor, Stonegate and sections of Route 130

Week of April 27, 2026 through May 1, 2026
Hickory Acres, Brooktree area, Renaissance Estates, Princeton East, Oak Creek Estates, Riveria, neighborhoods along Dutch Neck Road, One Mile Road and sections of Route 130

Customer Tips During Hydrant Flushing

- Check for discolored water by running cold water only before using washing machines or dishwashers. Allow the cold water to run until it becomes clear.
- If laundry becomes stained, do not place the items in the dryer. Rewash immediately using detergent and add a rust remover. Many rust removers can also be used on stained fixtures.
- If water pressure seems low after flushing, check faucet screens (aerators) for trapped particles and clean if necessary.
- Place garbage and recycling containers behind the curb to avoid obstructing flushing operations.
- Do not place loose leaves or debris at the curb, as they can block storm drains. Leaves and debris should be placed at least one foot away from the curb to allow water to flow freely.
